

## Homework Outline for P4-7



Homework will be set on a Monday via Seesaw. Answers should be written in your child's homework book (which will remain at home). This way you will not need to print-out any worksheets. When written homework is complete, please take a photograph and upload via Seesaw.

**Written homework should be completed and uploaded to Seesaw by a Wednesday evening.**

Learning of times-tables and spellings should be completed every night alongside reading. Spellings can be learnt through a range of strategies, both written and verbal. We will send out some activity ideas each week. Please complete one task from this spelling activity sheet weekly and evidence this through a photo or video on a Wednesday night. Children will learn 11 spellings per week.

We will be learning tables every night (as instructed by your child's teacher). Your child should practise through written and verbal methods and they may wish to showcase this through an audio clip, video clip or picture which can be uploaded via Seesaw. (P4 children will begin tables for homework later in the term).

Your child will take home their reading book on a Monday and return it to school on a Friday so that it can be quarantined over the weekend. Their teacher will keep a copy in school for guided reading during the day. Children will then read each night as part of their homework. Older children may have reading books which will stay at home for a number of weeks depending on their length.

### Homework Timetable

**Monday** - Literacy worksheet, learn times tables, Reading, Spellings - Learn first 5.

**Tuesday** - Numeracy worksheet, learn times tables, Reading, Spellings - Learn next 6.

**Wednesday** - Reading, Spellings Activity, Mathematics.

**Thursday** - Reading, Spellings - learn for test, learn times tables.

- The title for each night's homework will be the day and the date - please underline with pencil and ruler (P7 can use pen).
- If there are any problems, please ask your child's teacher. Do not spend too much time trying to complete something that you do not fully understand.
- Homework should take no longer than 30-45 minutes each night.
- Children may wish to leave a sensible comment with their uploaded homework if required.
